Dear Paul,

Application by the Institute of Legal Executives (ILEX) to become an approved regulator to award rights of probate to members of ILEX

Thank you for sending us the above applications and formally requesting our advice in accordance with the provisions of the Legal Services Act 2007 ('the Act').

In providing our advice we have to consider whether an application, if granted, would (or would be likely to) prevent, restrict or distort competition within the market for reserved legal services to any significant extent¹.

We have considered the application and, if granted, we advise that we find no evidence or theory to suggest that ILEX becoming an approved regulator to award rights of probate to members of ILEX would (or would be likely to) prevent, restrict or distort competition within the market for the reserved legal activity of probate.

From a competition perspective, where a new application relates to a sector of the legal services market in which there is an existing approved regulator, unless there is compelling evidence to show a significant detriment to competition and/or consumer protection, the OFT is unlikely to raise any substantive objection since it is likely to increase choice for consumers.

The OFT, therefore, considers that allowing ILEX members authorisation to deliver independent probate services, within the parameters outlined in the

application, may strengthen competition for probate services. For example, ILEX members could act as an alternative supply of probate services thus increasing competition and broadening access to consumers
